Has there been a time in your life when you felt like you were being whirled around in a washing machine? If not, come to the kanthari Institute sometime around the 6th week into the course and you won't be disappointed.

Well, it starts slow at first: Door open, insert the ideas, close the door, push start... water flows in for the pre-wash...

The main goal of this exercise: 'If you really want a change, you need to have the courage to part with your old, cherished ideas, break them down into their component, improve them, reassemble them anew to form a solid foundation on which the future organisation can be built.

For most participants, the sixth week of the kanthari course resulted in the birth of their new,

own(ed) idea of how problems can be addressed/solved. And this birth is usually quite painful, emotional and accompanied by tears and anger. But then, one day, after exhausting weeks with sleepless nights, in which the old conventional concepts are questioned and shaken, there is that magic moment, when the realisation sets in that unconventional ideas are needed to solve old problems. And it is precisely these ideas that the participants will be presenting to the public in the upcoming SPREAD THE SPICE festival.

quieted down. Unlike previous years, Paul, Ajith and I decided not to join the trip, and this felt good for the first 2 days. No long nights in dusty trains, no hours of waiting for buses surrounded by mosquitoswarms, none of the usual quarrels that occur after nights with little sleep.

But when we listened to the recorded daily reflections, we became a little nostalgic and wished to be with them on their journey visiting social and environmental organisations in Mumbai and Pune. The visits to numerous initiatives restarted most of their washing machines again and many came back with improved ideas, and with important take-aways of **what and what not to do.**

And since their return, act 3 including the BASCH course (business for social change) has been running in full swing. Every act has a final highlight. For act 3 it's the "<u>SPREAD THE SPICE</u>" Festival, an event that provides an insight into social and environmental projects from 12 different countries.

The major learning point for our participants is the organisation of an event with at least 25 stalls, 100+ volunteers, 3 days of exhibition with (hopefully) thousands of visitors, with entertainment and catering. And it offers a chance to gain experience in raising funds too.

Mary from Kenya and Emmanuel from Cameroon are the master planners, and all understand and experience what it means to work with/in teams to realize a bigger goal. Three kanthari graduates shared the following updates:

<u>WILD</u> – Shivani – Bihar, India - 2021 kanthari graduate

"At WILD we support the Environment and marginalized community through conserving indigenous knowledge of food and farming. Through TV shows, live cooking, workshops on millets, millet seeds and recipe book distribution, we have reached/worked with 2000 farmers across 59+ villages.

Just recently we had a special opportunity, we were invited to showcase our millet based products in front of first lady's from around the world at the G20 summit in New Delhi. Besides our training activities, to reach more farmers and consumers, we presented our products in 16 exhibitions. We continue our work for better health, environment and dignified livelihood for members who are situated on the margins of society."

<u>Fireflies</u> – Gautham NC – Kerala – India – 2022 kanthari graduate "Fireflies vision is a community free

from crime, addiction, and mental health challenges.

In the past three months, we've turned an empty space into 'Chimminikood', a vibrant hub for youth empowerment. With minimal funds, we engaged over 40 young beneficiaries from Kasaragod, revitalizing the space and securing essential kitchen and office equipment through material drives. The hub launched with a musical night and hosted weekly events, including a cooking work-





shop and volunteer meetups. In August, we welcomed the 2023 kanthari participants, enjoying an Onam Sadya together. It was a once-in-a-lifetime experience for all our beneficiaries to spend time with social changemakers from across the globe.

Now, we're gearing up for the second edition of our seven-day youth empowerment workshop, Saptha, a transformative journey of self-discovery and growth."

Centro Colibri – <u>Carolina Ortiz</u> – Bolivia – 2019 kanthari graduate

"In Centro Colibrí we provide holistic services to victims of sexual violence, and we run a training program to empower women and families to prevent all types of violence.

During the past quarter, we have focused on Empowering Women and the Family. We organized training courses in making Chocolate, Jams and Sweets, Event Decoration, Journals from Junk, Tubular bead necklaces, as well as a course on professional Makeup. A total of 600 women, children and also several men participated. Additionally, we collected toys and

materials for our space to support girls and adolescents in Colibrí."
